**THEME: SUBCONTRACTING POLICY FOR BATSWANA OWNED COMPANIES**

To ask the Minister of Transport and Public Works:

- (i) to provide updated information on the number of projects awarded to Chinese-owned companies and the total value of such projects under his Ministry since the year 2020, as of the most recent data available;
- (ii) if there is any data or records available regarding the extent to which the 30 percent subcontracting policy for Batswana-owned companies has been fulfilled in these projects and if so, could the Minister provide those details;
- (iii) to elaborate on the reasons for any variations that may occur between the contracted sum and the end sum paid for in these projects and if there are any specific examples or statistics available regarding these variations;
- (iv) considering the Minister's mention of difficulties in retrieving information due to COVID-19 related office closures, could he provide a timeline or plan for when the missing data on end sums paid for these projects will be available and accessible;
- (v) in light of the Minister's acknowledgement that records on the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) of these companies have not been maintained, could he share plans to establish and maintain such records in the future to ensure transparency and accountability in similar projects; and
- (vi) are there any specific guidelines or mechanisms in place to monitor and evaluate the Corporate Social Responsibility contributions of companies involved in these projects and if so, could the Minister provide details on how these are implemented and enforced.

- 1. MR. M. G. J. MOTSAMAI, MP. (GHANZI SOUTH):** To ask the Minister of Youth, Gender, Sport and Culture to state: **(335)**

  - (i) progress in the construction of the Botswana National Library Services (BNLS) headquarters;
  - (ii) how much was used for the design of this building; and
  - (iii) if the plot still exists at Central Business District where it was to be located.
  
- 2. MR. O. RAMOGAPI, MP. (PALAPYE):** To ask the Minister of Education and Skills Development to apprise this Honourable House on technical colleges and brigades stating the following: **(344)**

  - (i) the total number of students who graduate in Trade Test B the whole of Botswana per year;
  - (ii) the total number of students who progress to National Craft Certificate per year;
  - (iii) the total number of students who fail to progress to the next level per year;
  - (iv) what the Ministry is doing regarding students who are unable to progress to the next level due to shortage of spaces despite passing Trade Test B;
  - (v) why the Minister is not building a new Technical college; and
  - (vi) what the Ministry is doing about the shortage of equipment, practical materials, tools and lecturers' accommodation.
  
- 3. MR. K. NKAWANA, MP. (SELEBI PHIKWE EAST):** To ask the Minister of Environment and Tourism: **(349)**

  - (i) to state the number of farmers who have successfully managed to introduce game animals in their small holding farms;
  - (ii) to quantify the level of economic benefit to the farmers; and
  - (iii) if the Government intends to assist potential small holdings game farmers in the development of such farms as well as capture and stocking.

4. **MR. K. K. KAPINGA, MP. (OKAVANGO):** To ask the Minister of Justice **(351)** whether he is aware that it takes an inordinately long time for records of proceedings to be transcribed by the lower courts of law for transmission to the appellate courts and that this delay occasions considerable prejudice to appellants, for example, those whose applications for bail pending appeal have to remain pending for a long time due to unavailability of a transcribed record of proceedings; if so:
- (i) what measures are, or are to be put in place to ensure the swift transcription of records of proceedings; and
  - (ii) to state the estimated cost of procuring a stenography machine for all courts of law.

Creation of a tourism city in this Region would not only put the country in a better position to exploit the rich natural resources found in the Region and to create jobs, but also because the country is ready for an additional city to alleviate crowding in the existing towns and cities."

**AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ACT**

20. "That this Honourable House requests Government to consider amending the Public Holidays Act so that it reads "if a public holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the Monday becomes a public holiday" as opposed to reading "if the public holidays listed fall on a Sunday then the Monday shall be a public holiday" as it has now become common that if a holiday falls on a Saturday then the next Monday is declared a public holiday at short notice and this disrupts planning and is bad for business."
