QUESTIONS

1. **MR. C. K. JACOBS, MP. (LOBATSE):** To ask the Minister of Trade and Entrepreneurship when the adopted 2013 Parliamentary Motion will be implemented which was calling for the Lobatse town to be treated as a special area as a way of reviving its economy through the Lobatse Economic Diversification Unit, similar to SPEDU. **(238)**
2. **MR. A. K. KHAN, MP. (MOLEPOLOLE NORTH):** To ask the Minister of Sport and Arts if he is aware that most foreign sport coaches employed in the country are not sufficiently qualified to coach local athletes, despite having been granted work permits; and if so, what measures he will take to ensure that only qualified and competent coaches are engaged in developing Botswana's sporting talent. **(277)**
3. **MR. M. M. PULE, MP. (KGATLENG EAST):** To ask the Minister of Higher Education to indicate if the Government intends to increase student allowances in line with the current Government's commitment to raise the amount to 2,500 pula; and if so, to state:
 - (i) the timeline for this increase and outline how the Government plans to ensure the sustainability of this allowance, given the current economic condition in Botswana; and
 - (ii) measures the Government will take to ensure that this support effectively addresses the financial challenges faced by students.

4. **MR. T. FURNITURE, MP. (TATI EAST):** To ask the Minister for State President, Defence and Security to apprise this Honourable House on Botswana Police Savings and Loan Guarantee Scheme for the year ended 2025; and to further state: (360)
- (i) from which year these dividends were declared, what happened to the dividends declared from the scheme since its inception in 1999; and
 - (ii) the criteria used to select officers who have retired from active service as it seems that some officers who are no longer members of the scheme benefitted while others were left out.
5. **MR. O. KWAPA, MP. (JWANENG-MABUTSANE):** To ask the Minister of Labour and Home Affairs whether there is any law which binds certain businesses to transport their staff members at night when they are going to and coming from work especially when public transport is not available. (431)
6. **MR. D. SALESHANDO, MP. (MAUN NORTH):** To ask the Minister for State President, Defence and Security why the Sovereign Wealth Fund is managed under his Ministry and not the Ministry of Finance which has the requisite staff competencies to oversee the nation's long-term financial investments; he should further state: (432)
- (i) how the board members of the Sovereign Fund were selected;
 - (ii) how the Chief Executive Officer of the Sovereign Fund was selected;
 - (iii) how much has been invested in the fund up to date and how the fund will be further capitalised; and
 - (iv) the applicable law under which the fund has been established.
7. **BRIGADIER D. MOKGWATHI, MP. (LETLHAKENG):** To ask the Minister of Environment and Tourism to apprise this Honourable House on the short and long term measures on: (438)
- (i) the preservation of indigenous plants, *motshiha*, *khyara*, *mositsana* and *leruswa*; and
 - (ii) culture preservation based on oral history of the Letlhakeng District.
8. **DR. U. DOW, MP. (KGATLENG WEST):** To ask the Minister of Trade and Entrepreneurship to state: (440)
- (i) the various licenses under which a trader or business can sell alcohol;

- (ii) the key requirements for each type of license; and
- (iii) conditions under which a trader can sell the alcoholic beverage commonly known as Chibuku.

"That this Honourable House requests Government to consider exempting registered non-operating businesses or shelf companies from filing fees or paying annual returns as well as to reduce filing fees for annual returns of operating business entities, restoration fees for businesses and companies deactivated and removed from the CIPA register."

**REVIEW AND UPWARD ADJUSTMENT OF THE COMPENSATION RATES

"That this Honourable House resolves that Government immediately reviews and upwardly adjust the compensation rates which no longer reflect the true market value for loss of life, injury, livestock and crops, for the purposes of aligning them, with current market prices and inflation in order to promote the coexistence between the people of Botswana and wildlife."

**CITIZEN ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CEDA)
TO DISCONTINUE THE ISSUANCE OF LOANS**

17. "That this Honourable House requests Government to discontinue the issuance of loans by the Citizen Entrepreneurial Development Agency (CEDA) and instead partner with commercial banks for all credit facilities by providing surety."

AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ACT

18. "That this Honourable House requests Government to consider amending the Public Holidays Act so that it reads, "if a public holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the Monday becomes a public holiday" as opposed to reading, "if the public holidays listed fall on a Sunday then the Monday shall be a public holiday" as it has now become common that if a holiday falls on a Saturday then the next Monday is declared a public holiday at short notice and this disrupts planning and is bad for business."

ESTABLISHMENT OF A SPECIAL FUND FOR GENDER BASED VIOLENCE (GBV)

19. "That this Honourable House requests Government to strengthen Botswana's commitment to gender equality and the protection of its citizens by establishing a Special Fund for Gender Based Violence (GBV) to provide immediate, targeted financial resources for prevention, survivor support and legal redress."
