- 1. MR. A. K. KHAN, MP. (MOLEPOLOLE NORTH): To ask the Minister for State (353) President to explain the functions and roles of the Department of Broadcasting Services and Department of Information Services; and to further state:
 - (i) the staff compliment for each department in terms of core duty and support staff;
 - the number of outstations each department has, and how many outstations are headed by personnel in salary scales C1, D4, D3, D2 and D1 in each department;
 - (iii) why the Department of Information Services has more officers heading outstations on C1 and D3 salary scales whereas the same is not done at the Department Broadcasting Services;
 - (iv) the number of officers (reporters) on C1 salary scale top notch in the Department of Information Services and Department of Broadcasting Services; and
 - (v) why employees at the Department of Broadcasting Services seem to progress better career wise than those working for the Department of Information Services.
- 2. MR. M. M. PULE, MP. (KGATLENG EAST): To ask the Minister of (355) Environment and Tourism to state:
 - (i) concrete steps that Government has taken to implement key policy objectives of the Climate Change Policy, 2021, particularly on efforts to reduce dependence on fossil fuel, enhance food security in drought-prone areas as well as to address increasing climate variability;
 - (ii) measures in place to ensure adequate climate financing and whether Botswana is leveraging on international funding sources such as the Green Climate Fund (GCF) to support adaptation and mitigation efforts; and

- (iii) plans to review and strengthen climate adaptation strategies, particularly for communities that are mostly at risk of extreme weather events considering that Botswana remains highly vulnerable to climate change effects.
- 3. MR. J. J. FRENZEL, MP. (SHASHE WEST): To ask the Minister for State (358) President:
 - (i) if he is aware of the lack of a fully functional police station between Francistown and Orapa;
 - (ii) what plans are in place to rectify the situation; and
 - (iii) when the lack of police vehicles at Chadibe and Mabesekwa villages will be addressed.
- 4. MR. T. FURNITURE, MP. (TATI EAST): To ask the Minister of Health if he is aware of the deplorable conditions of Ditladi Health Post and that the building is old and has not been maintained for a long time; if so, what does he intend doing to rectify this situation.
- 5. MR. L. BARONGWANG, MP. (MOGODITSHANE EAST): To ask the Minister of (363) Environment and Tourism:
 - if any comprehensive study with a detailed report has ever been conducted to provide feedback from the Hotel and Tourism Business community following the introduction and implementation of local travel per diem;
 - (ii) to provide latest data from the Ministry on;
 - (a) decline and/or increase in occupancy rates at licensed small to medium hotels, lodges, and guesthouses across the country:
 - (b) the number of small to medium accommodation providers that have closed their operations since the Policy's implementation;
 - (iii) to outline measures put in place to ensure that the Local Travel Per Diem Policy does not adversely affect the small to medium hotels, guest houses and lodges operators; and
 - (iv) how the Government ensures that the Government travel expenditure directly supports small to medium, dully registered, and tax-compliant local businesses.

- 6. MR. G. DISHO, MP. (OKAVANGO EAST): To ask the Minister of Lands and (357) Agriculture to apprise this Honourable House on:
 - (i) what the Government intends doing with Kilo 70 camp in the Okavango East in which a lot of modern houses were built;
 - (ii) how much was spent for their construction; and
 - (iii) how long these houses have been there without being occupied.
- 7. MR. M. M. MOROLONG, MP. (KGATLENG CENTRAL): To ask the Minister of (360) Environment and Tourism to explain what led to the stoppage of the Matsieng Air Show; and whether there are any plans to resuscitate it in the near future.
- 8. MR. C. K. JACOBS, MP. (LOBATSE): To ask the Minister of Water and (361) Human Settlement to state:
 - (i) if he is aware of water shortage in Lobatse; and
 - (ii) plans in place to address the situation.
- 9. MR. M. MOALOSI, MP. (NKANGE): To ask the Minister of Health to update this Honourable House on the Alcohol and Tobacco levy and whether it has been properly administered since its inception; and to further state:
 - (i) the amount of money collected from levies since 2019 and how much was used:
 - (ii) the number of individuals who have recovered as a result of the current Government levy intervention given the recent security threats posed by substance use disorders;
 - (iii) the Ministry's plans regarding the utilisation of the levy to curb substance use disorder and mental health issues among youth; and
 - (iv) if there are plans to establish rehabilitation centers across the country and benefit from the funds.
- 10. MR. R. W. KAIZER, MP. (SELEBI PHIKWE WEST): To ask the Minister of (365) Transport and Infrastructure to update this Honourable House on the Botswana Railways forensic audit, and further state:
 - (i) the merits of appointing R4 Forensic Botswana;

- (ii) when the forensic audit started and how far it has gone; and
- (iii) the findings if it has been concluded.

 - (ii) how many have been paid claims that were due to them for participating in the General Elections;
 - (iii) when all the officers will be paid for their participation in the 2024 General Elections;
 - (iv) the cause of the delay in paying officers for the work they did during the General Elections: and
 - (v) whether the delayed payment affects other public servants who were engaged during the General Elections.
- 12. MR. P. M. SEGOKGO, MP. (TLOKWENG): To ask the Minister for State President to state the criterion used to select Botswana Public Officers Pension Fund (BPOPF) asset managers, where the criterion is written and whether politically exposed individuals e.g. political activists or President's de facto advisors can be given money to invest; if so:
 - (i) is he aware that:
 - (a) one of the Directors of a company called Africa Light House which is favoured to invest the pensions is politically exposed as he advised a former President and a political party, and if so, whether this is not a violation of the ordinances and what action he will take;
 - (b) the said Director has no knowledge, experience or expertise in the industry the pensions have been invested in and if it is safe to invest in this manner; and

- (ii) whether the political exposure of this Director is not a concern and whether there is action now or in the past against such a Director of Light House Capital.
