THEME: STATUS AND FUTURE OF THE MMAMANTSWE COAL PROJECT IN KGATLENG CENTRAL

To ask the Minister of Minerals and Energy to:

- (i) provide an update on the current status of the Mmamantswe Coal Mine in Kgatleng District;
- (ii) explain if the project has been officially shelved, and if so, what were the primary reasons for this decision;
- (iii) state actions, if any, that are being taken by Government to revive or repurpose the Mmamantswe Coal Project, considering its potential economic benefits for the country, as well as local employment and infrastructure development opportunities in Kgatleng Central; and
- (iv) state what is the expected timeline, if any, for decisions on the project's future during the current Government's term.

- 1. MR. L. BARONGWANG, MP. (MOGODITSHANE EAST): To ask the Minister of (378) Minerals and Energy to apprise this Honourable House on the Shareholders of Minergy Energy and their Shareholders' percentage and to further state:
 - (i) if any State-owned entity has ever funded the Mine, if so;
 - (a) state the period(s) and the amounts;
 - (b) the status of the facility/loan (if the loan is in arrears or it is up to date on repayments):
 - (c) how much the mine contributed towards Government coffers as royalties and as profit sharing; and

- (ii) the total quantities of coal mined from inception of the mine to date.
- 2. MR. G. KEKGONEGILE, MP. (MAUN EAST): To ask the Minister of Child (379) Welfare and Basic Education to brief this Honourable House on the magnitude of challenges faced by Form 3 and Botswana General Certificate of Secondary Education (BGCSE) leavers who have not accessed their certificates to date; in particular:
 - (i) total number of such learners nationally and reasons for not accessing the certificates;
 - (ii) the perceived impact of such none accessibility of certificates to learners in furthering their studies and the Ministry's mitigating factors;
 - (iii) the high amount of P250.00 per certificate paid by learners who lost certificates and the Ministry's plans to reduce the amount; and
 - (iv) why lost or uncollected certificates are so high given diversity of reasons inclusive of children living in difficult circumstances being part of the affected e.g. orphans, Rural Area Dwellers (RADS) and needy children.
