- 1. MR. P. M. SEGOKGO, MP. (TLOKWENG): To ask the Minister of Local (319) Government and Traditional Affairs if he is aware that primary school students are asked to bring stationery to schools in Tlokweng; if so, what is he doing to address the issue.
- 2. MR. J. J. FRENZEL, MP. (SHASHE WEST): To ask the Minister of Lands and Agriculture when services for Matsitama, Mathangwane, Jamataka and Makobo will be relocated to Tonota Sub-Land Board so as to bring services closer to the people.
- 3. MR. T. FURNITURE, MP. (TATI EAST): To ask the Minister of Minerals and (322) Energy to update this Honourable House on illegal mining happening in the Matsiloje area and measures in place to prevent this.
- **4.** MR. M. BAGAISAMANG, MP. (SHOSHONG): To ask the Minister of Minerals (323) and Energy if she:
 - (i) is aware of the state of the Mahalapye River with regards to excessive mining of sand;
 - (ii) is aware of developments activities in the area where villages benefited due to Corporate Social Responsibilities; and
 - has plans to develop a model that will benefit the villages along the Mahalapye River.
- 5. MR. C. K. JACOBS, MP. (LOBATSE): To ask the Minister of Higher (324) Education:
 - (i) to state the mandate of the Labour Market Observatory (LMO) committee and if it has achieved any of the goals set out in its mandate;
 - (ii) how effective this committee has been in collecting and disseminating data on Botswana's labour market;
 - (iii) if LMO reports and findings are being used to inform policies and strategies aimed at reducing unemployment and addressing graduates and labour market skills mismatches;

- (iv) what steps Government is taking to ensure that the LMO has adequate resources, capacity, and technology to fulfil its mandate;
- (v) to provide examples of key initiatives or decisions that have been directly influenced by the LMO's work; and
- (vi) what mechanisms are in place to ensure collaboration between the LMO, the Human Resource Development Council and other stakeholders to create a cohesive approach to workforce development and employment creation.
- 6. MR. R. M. LEKUTLANE, MP. (KGALAGADI NORTH): To ask the Minister of Minerals and Energy to apprise this Honourable House on the upgrading of the Zutshwa Salt Pan Mine with the intention to create employment in Kgalagadi North.
- 7. MR. T. BOGATSU, MP. (LENTSWELETAU-LEPHEPHE): To ask the Minister of (326) Child Welfare and Basic Education:
 - (i) to explain her Ministry's relationship with the Botswana Communication Regulatory Authority (BOCRA) personnel in primary schools;
 - (ii) whether they are contracted by the Ministry of Local Government and Traditional Affairs and the wages paid by BOCRA; and
 - (iii) who should absorb them at the end of their three (3) year term contract.
- 8. MR. R. W. KAIZER, MP. (SELEBI PHIKWE WEST): To ask the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to apprise this Honourable House on the status of the Blue Mark Service offered by Botswana Railways (BR), he should further explain:
 - (i) if the service is still offered inhouse by BR, if not, who it is currently outsourced to; and
 - (ii) whether BR controls the courier service charges for this service.
- 9. MR. P. K. MOTAOSANE, MP. (THAMAGA-KUMAKWANE): To ask the Minister of Lands and Agriculture when his Ministry will allocate residential plots in Kumakwane.
- 10. MR. K. NKAWANA, MP. (SELEBI PHIKWE EAST): To ask the Minister of (330) Water and Human Settlement to provide detailed information on:
 - (i) the number of residential houses owned by the Central Government;

- (ii) how many of these houses are occupied;
- (iii) how many are not occupied; and
- (iv) how many are dilapidated.
- 11. MR. M. M. PULE, MP. (KGATLENG EAST): To ask the Minister of Finance (302) to state:
 - (i) if the Government has any intention or plan to construct a border crossing facility for the people in Oliphants Drift, Ramotlabaki, and Phala Camp who currently struggle to cross at the Sikwane Border Post; and
 - (ii) the timeframe for when this plan will be implemented.
