**1. Minister of Health**

**THEME: EMPOWERMENT THROUGH TENDERS**

To ask the Minister of Health that since the new procurement law, and in respect of the Ministry's procurement tenders to date, how much has been awarded to 100% citizen owned companies versus non-citizen companies; and further state:

- (i) what was being purchased;
- (ii) for all items purchased from non-citizen companies, do the companies manufacture the items or they are simply agents and distributors of the same items;
- (iii) what proportion of each of the above applies specifically to Sir Ketumile Masire Teaching Hospital;
- (iv) why the Ministry continues to award tenders to distributors and agents who are not 100% Botswana citizen companies; is the Ministry against citizen economic empowerment Acts; and
- (v) when will this practice at (iv) above come to an end.

**2. Minister of Lands and Water Affairs**

**THEME: NEGATIVE EFFECTS OF THE AMENDED TRIBAL LAND ACT OF 2018**

To ask the Minister of Lands and Water Affairs if he is aware of Botswana's outcry regarding the adverse effects of the implementation of the amended Tribal Land Act of 2018 and further state whether:

- (i) the fees charged by Land Boards for transfer of property are just too high;
- (ii) there should not be separate dispensations for valuation of properties that are for sale with those that are inheritable (for widows and widowers);

- (iii) the Minister does not consider revising the issue of application fees, so that it is paid only by those with successful applications; and
- (iv) the plots waiting list cannot be maintained for fewer people using a continuous vetting process.

**INTRODUCTION OF A POLICY THAT COMPELS SUPERMARKETS TO SUB  
CONTRACT THEIR IN-HOUSE BUTCHERIES AND BAKERIES**

"That this Honourable House requests Government to come up with a policy that compels supermarkets to sub-contract their in-house butcheries and bakeries to 100% citizen owned businesses in which the supermarket owners are not shareholders as a way of making up for mainstay businesses such as bakeries and general dealers which have generally closed down due to being outmuscled by supermarkets."
